


I enjoyed our work on monologues. I thought we were able to learn from commenting on each other's work and receiving coaching. I think the films really detracted from the class itself though. We didn't really learn anything after those first classes with the monologues because we didn't end up doing scenes for class in order to get the films done. Also I know the syllabus said we would need to meet periodically out of class, but we often were meeting outside of class a lot and with very little notice. The short films were the best part of the class. They gave real acting experience at a film shoot. I think if there could be either more films or less students in the class that would be ideal. Just to give students more chances to work. The monologues at the beginning of the class were helpful. It was definitely a bummer not everyone got the opportunity to do them on camera and in person as zoom did not translate as well. But it was very useful both times either way. The shooting of the movies were obviously very useful and informative. Question: Please elaborate on the quality of your learning experience. I learned a lot about the processes of a film set as a featured actor, extra, and tech person. I learned a lot from this course and I think other students did as well. I think splitting the class up into two courses would make it so we werent so pressed for time to finish the short films. Ive gotten a glimpse of how my largely theatrical training must be adjusted for camera work. The individual nature of the character creation process made for an insightful look into my potential future. I learned a good deal about camera acting and what it's like to operate on a film set. While the projects we contributed to were great opportunities, I would have appreciated a little more time dedicated to dissecting on-camera acting techniques and learning what to alter about our performances to better suit oncamera work. I wish we would've went more into detail about camera acting itself. I think we should've done the little in between scenes like last film festival. I feel like the only value we gained from the class was being able to work very spontaneously. Even with studying the script you could not be fully aware of how the shots would go which I assume is accurate to the real world. Other than that I do not feel like I learned a lot from this course. I think what would really help is a more concrete way of getting out information. I usually found out filming plans from other students because they had conversed with the professor some other time and if I hadn't asked them I wouldn't have known where or when we were filming. The monologue section was less informative then the short films. I felt working on the short films was exciting and intriguing. The only issue is sometimes having to do late night shoots however this was compensated by the lack of having to meet in person for class on account of another scene being filmed. I feel very fortunate to take this course and have had the opportunity to act on camera and have work for my portfolio. I feel that this alone is a huge benefit. I do wish however we had spent more time beforehand to learn the technique of acting on camera and maybe more about the industry itself. Question: Evaluate the Quality of Instruction. 




